

ADMIRAL RAEDER BURIED

Doenitz at Rites for Former Chief of Hitler's Navy

KIEL, Germany, Nov. 11 (AP)—A funeral service for Admiral Erich Raeder attracted a crowd of several thousand today to the old Garrison Church here.

Admiral Raeder, architect of Hitler's navy and its chief commander until 1943, died last Sunday at the age of 84. Over his coffin was draped the ensign of Germany's Imperial Navy.

The mourners were headed by former Admiral Carl Doenitz, who succeeded Admiral Raeder as wartime head of Hitler's Navy, and Vice Admiral Friederich Ruge, present chief of the West Germany Navy.

Admiral Raeder was convicted by an Allied War Crimes court after World War II but was released from prison in 1955 because of old age and ill health.
