

Doenitz to Get Pension When He Is Freed Oct. 1

BONN, Germany, Sept. 24 (UP)—Former Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz will receive a \$310 monthly pension when he completes his prison term for war crimes Oct. 1, Government sources said today.

Doenitz, who succeeded Adolf Hitler when the Third Reich crumbled in 1945, is to be discharged from Spandau Prison in East Berlin on completion of the ten-year sentence handed down at the Nuremberg war crimes trials in 1946.

The sources said he would qualify for a pension under an article of the West German Constitution that provides full pension rights for former Government employes who were in Government service on May 8, 1945.
