

## **DOENITZ URGES REICH TO 'FANATICAL' UNITY**

Fleet Admiral Karl Doenitz, Commander in Chief of the German Navy, called on German workers yesterday to support Adolf Hitler with "fanaticism" because his leadership will "eventually" result in victory, the DNB agency reported.

In a wireless dispatch to the German domestic press DNB quoted Admiral Doenitz as saying that if the Reich surrendered, the German people would have cause to be ashamed of themselves in later years when their children and grandchildren reproached them in terms such as these: "You were cowardly and we have now to suf-

fer for it because you did not then remain hard and hold out."

Admiral Doenitz, who was addressing a rally in the Weser-Ems region on the North Sea, added:

"We must stick together fanatically. This our greatest strength, and we must with all fanaticism follow our Fuehrer, that man who in his unique greatness combines the profound humanity of a warm heart with vast knowledge, skill and iron determination. There is none whom one should follow with greater love than this man, who has no peer. This leadership, harder than fate itself, will eventually be crowned with victory."

The DNB dispatch, which was reported by the Federal Communications Commission, quoted Doenitz as declaring that "the fight-

ing morale of the navy is unbroken," although "it goes without saying that this war cannot be waged without losses."

"But men who know how to die," Doenitz added, "are immortal, and they are the fount from which ever new forces and heroes are coming forth."
